Introduction

This assignment is to write an instruction manual for those over 65 who wish to use social media. Some older people are very technologically savvy and have been using social media for years; some have never used a smartphone. For this assignment, I am erring on the side of less technical knowhow and writing for those who have never used social media, and have never downloaded apps on their smartphones. I will assume that the user has an Android smartphone that has already been set up for use, which means they have an email address and access to the Google Play Store.

Understanding the Procedure

App Selection

I will be writing instructions for Facebook and Facebook Messenger using an Android Phone.

Our audience's main goals are to stay connected to family and friends. They can do this through interacting publicly on the news feed and privately via Messenger.

User Analysis

Our audience is made up of older people, most of whom do not have a technical background, who would like to stay connected to their family and friends. They own a smartphone but only use it for basic tasks like phone calls and text messaging. They know the phone is capable of much more, but do not know where or how to start. They want to use their smart phone to access Facebook in order to keep up with their friends and family. They do not need or want to be able to use every feature of Facebook but they would like to view and share photos, read and post status updates, and chat (text and video). They are willing to learn but do not want to be bogged down with too many technical details or unneeded complexity.

User Personas



Patti is an 85-year-old widow with a large family that is spread throughout the country. She retired from a career as a nurse never having worked in any technological field. She has had a home computer for many years but rarely uses it. Up until a recent move, she had dial-up internet. She spends very little time online, and keeps up with her family and friends via telephone and letterwriting. Her large family is becoming more and more spread out and busy, so she feels like she's missing out on a lot by not being able to follow their activities online. She is ready to use Facebook so she can interact with her family. She needs instructions that explain each concept to her.



Susan is 75 years old. She retired years ago due to a physical disability which leaves her mostly home-bound. She wants to be able to keep in touch with her friends and family, keep updated on national news, and continue being a political activist. Previous to her retirement she was employed as a computer programmer and analyst so she has a background in computers. She understands how the technology works and has used the internet since it became widely available in the 90's. She has a Facebook account and uses the desktop version. Although she knows about technology and followed its development in the news, she was slow to adopt new innovations. She only recently bought a smartphone and has found that it's not as easy to adapt to as she thought. She needs instructions on how to use the smartphone version of the Facebook app.
